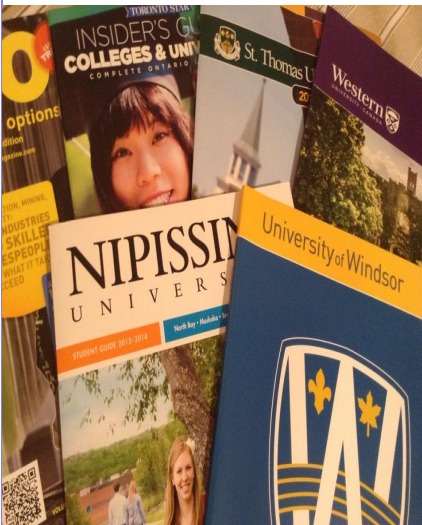

POST SECONDARY SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

This is the second part of the series of topics related to Post Secondary Education. This month our topic is scholarships.

Post-secondary Education can be expensive and for all new immigrants the money could become a big obstacle to continue studying. Fortunately, scholarships can alleviate the cost. Most of the scholarships that organizations offer do not need high marks to apply. Rather, it is open to everyone. If you are interested, there are many ways of getting scholarships: you can apply to the school's designated scholarships or websites, for example; www.studentawards.com, www.scholarshipscanada.com, www.equals6.com and so on. Youth are eligible for all types of scholarships, ranging from leadership to educational success to heritage and culture.



If the students go to catholic schools, they are eligible for the TCDSB scholarships. Some might include: Sister Mary Hamilton Award for Exceptional Students, C.E.F.O Catholic Student Award, Catherine Temple Mathematics Awards. Another great scholarship option is the Angel Foundation. They offer awards, funds and bursaries for students. These opportunities range from \$100 to \$5000 for students. These applications require some specification but they offer a variety of scholarships. Some scholarships are for disabilities, visual arts, leadership experience and so on. They even offer bursaries for families with students in elementary and/or high school who cannot afford school events. They pay for the student's trip/event.
