Living in Canada it will be helpful for you to have one or two pieces of official identification. This will be especially helpful when you need to fill out any paperwork in any government office. There are two main official identifications: **Ontario Photo Card** or **Ontario Driver's License**.

ONTARIO PHOTO IDENTIFICATION CARD

This is an official photo ID for non-drivers, seniors and newcomers. You can apply if you are a resident of Ontario, older than sixteen years old and a non-driver. To obtain this ID you need to go to a Service Ontario location. To apply, you must bring an original identification document to prove your legal name, date of birth and signature (Passport, Confirmation of Permanent Resident, Record of Landing) The cost is \$35.
