Don't forget the date, mark it in your calendars!!

The requirement for voters depends on each level of government: municipal, provincial and federal. The requirement for each level is:

Municipal elections: Resident of Toronto, or own a business or have property, bring photo ID and your address.

Federal Elections: Must be a citizen of Canada, bring photo ID and address.

Provincial Elections: Must be a citizen of Canada (must be a resident of Ontario) you can sign "Statutory Declaration at the Poll" form.

Dental Health Information



Dental health is part of our daily care in Canada and it is important to know that the dental service comes with a high cost. In most cases for newcomers without medical insurance the cost of this service will be expensive but for newcomers living on social assistance the basic dental health care is covered for your children (younger than 18 years old). Otherwise, the adults need to pay for these services. In some cases dentists have plans and different treatments which vary in cost. It is important that you check and compare different options before you accept and commit to the treatment.

Other options are community clinics and dental schools that offer the same care but charge less. The attention depends on the demand of the services. Here is some information:

Low cost dental care for newcomers:

George Brown College (dental hygienist program) phone: 416-415-4547

Low cost cleaning teeth: September – mid June. Price \$40 for cleaning – covers multiple sessions. X-rays: extra \$40 maximum. Denture: September – April. Small fillings: January – March, very limited because it involves graduate students \$15 – \$25 per tooth. Call to make an appointment.

Durham College phone: 905-721-3074

Adults: \$25; children \$10 for cleaning, X-rays, periodontal scaling, oral cancer screening, sealants and fluoride treatments. Open Monday, Wednesday and Friday morning, and open Tuesday and Thursday evening. Call to make an appointment.
