### WHO CAN VOTE?

A Canadian citizen; and  
at least 18 years old; and  
a resident in the City of Toronto; or  
a non-resident of the City of Toronto, but you or your spouse own or rent property in the City; and not prohibited from voting under any law.

### REMEMBER TO BRING

One piece of identification with your name and qualifying (Toronto) address



Voter information card:

It will be sent to you in the mail in early October. It tells you when and where to vote on Election Day and the location of the Advance Polls.

**Important note:** You may only vote once in Toronto's municipal election and must vote in the ward where you live.

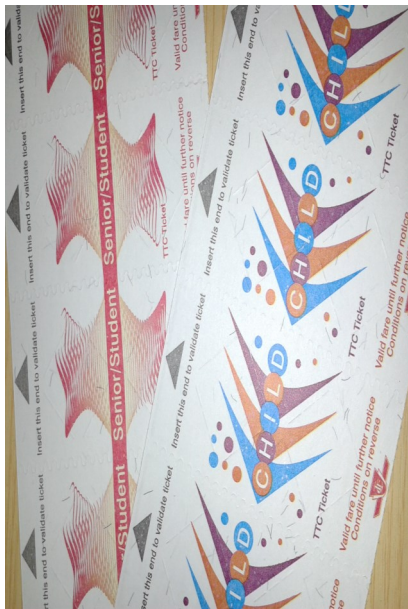

## TTC (Toronto Transit Commission) RIDES AND FARE INFORMATION 1



When first arriving to Canada, the TTC transportation and how it works, might be challenging to comprehend. Nevertheless, do not worry as we can provide you with some information that might ease your understanding when riding the TTC.

When traveling on the TTC, make sure that you check TTC route maps and bus schedules before starting your trip. As winter time approaches, it is important to prevent waiting at the bus stop for a long period of time.

### COST OF FARE:

Children (2 to 12 years old) pay \$0.75 or a child ticket per each ride.

Students (13 to 19 years old) pay \$2.00 cash or a student ticket or have a student pass.

Adults pay \$3.00 cash or an adult ticket or have a adult pass.

Senior (65+ years old) pay \$2.00 cash/senior ticket or have a senior pass.

The TTC system consists of three different forms of transportation:

**Buses:** All the buses that you see on the streets have their own bus stops and routes. For more information about the routes around Toronto: [www.ttc.ca/Routes/Buses.jsp](http://www.ttc.ca/Routes/Buses.jsp)

**Subways:** The fastest form of transportation across the city is through underground subways. There are four main subways lines:

- 1 **Yonge-University-Spadina Yellow line** has 32 stations and crosses Toronto from North to South (Finch to Downsview station)
- 2 **Bloor-Danforth Green line** has 31 stations and crosses Toronto from East to West (Kennedy to Kipling).
- 3 **Scarborough Blue Line** is the RT and has six stations. There is only one RT line in Toronto, begins at Kennedy station and continues to McCowan station.
- 4 **Sheppard Purple line** has five stations and operates in North York from West to East (Sheppard to Don Mills station).

**Streetcars:** This transportation system is only on specific streets and has only a few routes. Streetcars operate mostly around downtown. If you ever want to explore the city, take a long streetcar ride. [www.ttc.ca/Routes/Streetcars.jsp](http://www.ttc.ca/Routes/Streetcars.jsp)
