Refugees by the numbers

Every year on World Refugee Day, June 20, United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees releases a statistical profile of the population of the world'srefugees. This year the UNHCR reports:

- A record 22.5 million refugees in 2016 is the highest number recorded since the UNHCR was founded in 1950.
- A total of 65.6 million people have been forcibly displaced from homes as of last Dec, including 40.3 million still living within their own countries and not technically counted as refugees.
- 2.8 million refugees had formally applied for asylum at the end of last year, including 75,000 claims from children travelling alone or separated from parents. World's fastest growing refugee crisis is being generated by famine and war in South Sudan. 737,400 people had fled the country by the end of 2016.

NGO Committee to Stop Trafficking in Persons (CSTIP)'s ANNUAL REPORT

"NGO-CSTIP" formed powerful voice against human trafficking.
As a group, what they do is four-fold: they "initiate actions" that address trafficking locally and at the U.N.; they "facilitate organizing" at all levels, especially the grassroots, of access to U.N. processes and



agencies in collaboration with anti-human trafficking campaigns; they "advocate for stronger mechanisms" to monitor compliance with commitments to prevent, protect and prosecute under the *Palermo Protocols* and *International Labor Organization*; and they "support efforts" that provide services to the victims of human trafficking.
