

Asylum seekers and refugees are left sleeping on Toronto streets

"Since June 1st, hundreds of vulnerable asylum-seekers have been forced to sleep on cardboard on this sidewalk after the City of Toronto and the Federal Government got to a funding impasse. The worldly possessions and bodies of our siblings are protected from thunderstorms by garbage bags and tarps. No relief from the high heat. Not enough food or water.

The greatness of our City's soul will be measured by its capacity for compassion. These are human beings who have survived persecution and are experiencing trauma and abandonment by the City. They are not to be treated as political pawns." (ALEXA GILMOUR)

Shelter hotels have closed and the numbers of shelter beds overall is shrinking. Homeless shelters are reporting well over 30% of intakes are in fact refugee claimants and they are not being given indoor sleeping space or access to bathrooms and showers. And they're not given correct information about making a refugee claim in Canada.

SO - WHAT CAN WE DO, TODAY?

WE CAN:

- **Call or write** <u>your MP</u> and <u>City Councillor</u>. Ask that asylum seekers (refugee claimants) receive shelter and services and push for a resolution to that challenge, IMMEDIATELY.



JULY 30 IS WORLD DAY AGAINST HUMAN TRAFFICKING Theme: "Reach every victim of trafficking, leave no one behind"

There are many ways that you can help fight the horrific global problem of human trafficking, a crime that exploits women, children and men for numerous purposes including forced labour and sex. The International Labour Organization estimates that 21 million people are victims of forced labour globally. An estimated 40.3 million people—primarily women and girls—are currently being trafficked and exploited for TRAFFICKING profit. As Pope Francis urges, our aim should be "for every enslaved person to return to being a free agent of his or her own life and to take an active part in the construction of the common good." WHAT CAN WE DO?

Stay informed and support organizations like Talitha Kum, a worldwide network of consecrated religious committed against trafficking who have **TRAFFICKING** presented three "causes and vulnerabilities that contribute to human **IN PERSONS** trafficking": 1) unequal power structure in society, especially related to women, children, and indigenous; 2) inadequate migration policies that leave people vulnerable in an increasingly interconnected world;

3) an economic model that exploits human and environmental resources for the profit of the few in contrast with the exploitation of the many.
