





Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship

MARC MILLER was first elected in 2015 as the Member of Parliament for Ville-Marie—Le Sud-Ouest—Île-des-Sœurs in Montréal. He has previously served as Minister of Crown-Indigenous Relations and as Minister of Indigenous



Services. Before entering politics, he was a practising lawyer specializing in mergers and acquisitions, with a focus on international and commercial law, and worked in Montréal, Stockholm, and New York City. Previously, he served as an infantry soldier in the Canadian Armed Forces. Minister Miller made history in 2017 when he delivered a statement in the House of Commons entirely in Mohawk, marking the first time the language had been spoken in either the House of Commons Senate or Confederation. He has also been a forceful advocate for increased federal investment in affordable housing, public transit, and the Canada Child Benefit.


