Monday December 18, 2023: International Migrants Day



Since 2000, the United Nations has recognized December18 as International Migrants Day. It is a day to uphold our brothers and sisters who choose or are forced to migrate due to economic, environmental or social strife. There are an estimated 281 million, or 3.6% of the global population, living in a county other than their country of birth. See the 2022 UN's interactive migration report.

During the Advent Season, we remember that the Holy Family was a migrant family – on the move to Bethlehem and then to Egypt to escape Herod's threat to kill the newborn Jesus. What are our attitudes towards strangers seeking to live among us? As Christians, we are called to welcome the stranger, and when we do so, we welcome God in person. 
